KS1

This week KS1 enjoyed a fabulous trip to West Wittering. We were met by the lifeguard who explained to the children how they could keep safe on the beach. We ran activities such as sand art where children made beautiful pictures in the sand, sandcastle building, fossil hunting and paddling, which resulted in some very wet clothes for Year 2 as many children 'accidentally on purpose' fell over in the water's edge! The children also enjoyed an ice lolly and a beach picnic. It was wonderful to see them all having such fun and the weary adults couldn't understand why they were all so lively on the bus on the way home. Hopefully they all slept well for you!



LKS2

In LKS2, year 3 have been planning pranks and writing play scripts based on Roald Dahl's 'The Twits'. They will be performing their plays to KS1 next week. In science they have been learning the different parts of a plant and how water is transported through the roots and stem. Year 4 have been investigating animals and their habitats. Each class spent a whole day dedicated to science in which they learned about food chains and food webs before going out to the school grounds to identify different habitats. They then collected specimens of animals, both invertebrates and vertebrates, and tried to identify them using field guides and their own knowledge. They then drew and compared different animals and considered how each animal is adapted to its particular habitat. Both year groups have been thinking about moving on and, as part of this, they have visited the church where they engaged in a journey of prayer. At each prayer station they considered people who have helped them on their own journeys and the journeys others have to take, including those of refugees. This thought provoking activity engendered a sense of great calm and peace in the children.

UKS2

It's been a theme of transition this fortnight in UKS2. Many in year 6 have had transition days with their new schools and year 5 have visited local schools to get a taster of secondary life and to consider where they would like to go next year. On the theme of transitions both classes have visited church where they engaged in reflective prayer activities on the topic of change with Sandy and church volunteers. It's also been a creative couple of weeks in both years. Year 5 have completed and published narrative writing and both year groups contributed to the fabulous St Bart's music night. Year 6 rounded off their year with their magnificent show The Pirate of the Curry Bean that was hugely enjoyed by children and parents alike. Not satisfied with just being great actors Year 6 children have also been entrepreneurs in the making!
